Helen discussed the proposed changes to 'hyper acute' stroke services and children's surgery in our area.

Hyper Acute – where you are cared for, for up to the first 72 hours after having a stroke. It's the very specialist service, some people may require less than 72 hours of this care.

Currently there is a variation in services depending on where you are and where you go.

Rotherham 'hyper acute' unit see an average of only 400 patients per year.

There are a range of proposals for the changes to the hyper acute stroke and children's surgery. Where we are located, we would still have good access to all the services wherever they move to.
