Well it has been found by the <u>National Campaign</u> to End Loneliness that Loneliness and Social Isolation can cause: dementia, cardiovascular disease, depression, is as bad as smoking 15 cigarettes a day, is worse than obesity for overall health, increases your risk of death by 29%. At our December event patients were able to talk to various Befriending, Bereavement and other groups we had invited along about services and support available. The groups attending managed to help some lonely people, gained new volunteers, and said they found it useful to talk with others working in this field. ### <u>Staffing</u>

There are now three salaried Doctors working at our GP Practice. Two of these, Dr Ramalingam and Dr Goswami, both male, have started working recently. Dr Goswami works Tuesdays to Fridays, and Dr Ramalingam is working on Mondays and Tuesdays. Dr Abbot, the other salaried GP will be returning from maternity leave in February. One of our current GP Registrars Dr Gvazava has passed her final GP exam, and after completing her inhouse training in April this year, she will be able to work as an independent GP.

Dr Buhari will be reducing his commitment to the Practice from June 2019 and will no longer be working at the surgery on a Wednesday. As his availability will be greatly reduced patients with dermatology issues should see any GP as all of the Drs. at the Practice are qualified in general skin conditions and will refer the patient to secondary care if their condition requires further assessment.

**Practice Car Parking** Due to the establishing of a new team from Basildon Hospital at the St Andrews Centre next to our Practice building, up to a dozen car parking places may be used for this team on a day to day basis. This means that there may be more pressure on parking at the Practice, and if driving you should allow time to maybe queue for a parking space.
