e are pleased to say that all is on schedule for the grand opening of our new Pharmacy on Monday 13th May. It is amazing that so much can happen in so little time. Our builders prepared the space previously occupied by Dr Deery and Dr Rajap and handed it over to the pharmacy team on Monday 15th April. They confidently assure us that it will be fitted out, stocked with medicines and staff all trained in time for opening day - a total of just 4 weeks from start to finish.

t will be a great resource for us all. Obviously it will be convenient for anyone collecting a prescription immediately after seeing the doctor. However, it will be open for 100 hours each week (from 7am until 10.30pm Monday to Saturday and from 10am to 5pm on Sundays) so is much more convenient for collecting regular and repeat prescriptions.

he Pharmacy operates as a normal pharmacy and can be used by anyone, whether or not they are registered at our surgery. When the surgery is closed and the pharmacy is open prescriptions waiting for collection will be left in the pharmacy. The services that will be provided by the pharmacy are freely available to use by all and use is not restricted in any way. You are free to choose any pharmacy from which to have your prescribed medicines dispensed and you are not "locked in" to any pharmacy service provider. The pharmacy team are looking forward to providing everyone with an exceptional level of customer service so do drop in and meet them.

he rest of the building work is going well. We hope to be using the new consulting rooms on the first floor by the beginning of May and the lift should be in and working before the end of May, we hope. There will be disruption throughout the next few months as all the waiting rooms and corridors are redecorated and the carpets replaced with vinyl flooring. We apologise for any inconvenience but we are sure that the end result will make it worthwhile.

Some people have associated this change with our surgery redevelopment, which has been in the planning for the past two years since we were notified that we could spend £175,000 of 'Freed up resources' made available a few years ago when we and two other practices spent less than our allocated budget. We decided to use that money to install a lift and improve our facilities as much as we could.

We would like to reassure everyone that the NHS is not paying for the rest of the work that we are doing and is not paying for the Pharmacy. We estimate that the whole project is costing around £800,000 and we are having to borrow most of that money from the bank!
