### HEALTHY LIVES, HEALTHY PEOPLE: OUR STRATEGY FOR PUBLIC HEALTH IN ENGLAND

On 30 November 2010 the Government published a White Paper on public health, which sets out a new approach to public health, with responsibilities, freedoms and funding devolved where possible.

The core elements of the new system will be set out in the forthcoming Health and Social Care Bill and will, therefore, be subject to Parliamentary approval.

Mixtard is being withdrawn in December. If practices need ADVICE on changing to a suitable alternative, please contact:

Details required are:

- the patient's name, address, NHS number, DOB, BMI, GP and practice, most recent HBA1c;
- current Mixtard dose and whether by pen or syringe;
- whether the patient is monitoring their sugars.

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### INFLUENZA UPDATE

The LMC has recently received the following update from the Public Health Directorate at NHS Sheffield:

- Consultation rates and hospital admissions for influenza like illness are rising steadily across the country and there have been a number of H1N1 related deaths.
- The picture in Sheffield is similar, with a number of outbreaks of flu in primary schools and activity up in primary care.
- There have also been a number of hospital admissions with confirmed H1N1 influenza, some of whom have been seriously ill requiring ICU care.
- The age profile of admissions is similar to that experienced last winter with H1N1 infections.
- Those affected are predominantly younger adults, young children and those with pre-existing ill health.

- Pregnant women are over represented, as they were with swine flu.
- The Department of Health has issued advice to GPs that they should consider prescribing antiviral drugs, where necessary in at risk groups, in line with NICE guidance:

 At present there is no intention to carry out widespread confirmatory swabbing. A very limited number of swabs may be requested in specific instances, to confirm the diagnosis. If this is required, individual GPs will be contacted directly by the South Yorkshire Health Protection Unit.

GPs are being asked to:

• Ensure that they make every effort to maximise the uptake of the seasonal flu vaccine among high risk patients - those with chronic respiratory, heart, renal and liver disease, diabetes, immunosuppression, pregnant women and those living in long stay residential care, as well as over 65s.

- Consider immunising those people who are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person, as per DH guidance.
- Be particularly vigilant for outbreaks of flu in residential and nursing homes. In these semi closed settings flu is likely to spread rapidly once introduced, and is often associated with high morbidity and mortality. Please alert the Health Protection Unit at the earliest opportunity if you suspect a flu outbreak in a care home.

# CARE QUALITY COMMISSION (CQC) REGISTRATION

Following some confusion about the CQC registration timetable, the GPC has confirmed that NHS GP practices do not yet have to comply with CQC standards.

NHS GP Practices will begin to be invited to apply for registration with CQC from 1 October 2011 and all will need to be registered from 1 April 2012.

In the application practices will need to declare compliance with 16 standards. Monitoring of compliance with the CQC standards will not commence until 1 April 2012.

It is worth noting that PCTMS practices should be registered with CQC because PCTs needed to be registered from 1 April 2010.

The GPC will be producing a guide on how to complete the application form for CQC registration and on how practices can comply with each of the CQC standards. They aim to publish this guide in spring 2011.

The CQC should be sending their first letter to all primary medical services providers about registration this month and will be publishing an introductory guide to registration. In the meantime, information already published can be found on the CQC website at:

# CERVICAL SCREENING IN PREGNANCY
