The time has come for renewing your BGPert membership for 2010-2011.

### **Why Bath Education Trust?**

BGPert has the largest membership of the Trusts in the Severn Deanery, currently running at 429. Members can also attend meetings arranged by Trusts in Bristol, Gloucestershire, Somerset and Swindon, and details can be found on Severn Deanery website at [http://primarycare.severn deanery.org/cpd/local\\_education\\_trusts](http://primarycare.severn deanery.org/cpd/local_education_trusts)

This year we have offered 82 meetings (16 daytime and 66 evening.) whilst introducing more recurring core skills events such a Basic Skin Surgery, Resuscitation and Child Protection. We have also supported 8 events run by other organisations and accredited by BGPert. Much of this is made possible because of the unique support of our valued colleagues at the RUH and RNHRD who provide expert resources for most of our meetings.

Meetings which display the *Education Kitemark* (See the top of this newsletter.) in all Severn Trusts are Quality Assured, with emphasis on appropriate learning objectives, facility for reflection and evaluation, and using a combination of speaker and smaller group formats.

### **Responsive to your needs**

Formal meetings evaluation identifies that the majority of events (over 70%) gain an *Excellent* score, with the majority of the remainder ranking sessions as *Good*. An impressive 97.5% of events meet your learning objectives!

We remain responsive to your needs. For example, many of you have requested an Ophthalmology session recently and so we have arranged a meeting in October.
