Essential Information...

We provide free and confidential sexual health services in Teesside including information and advice on all types of contraception and STI testing and treatment. Our service is confidential, non-judgmental and for people of all ages, genders and orientations.

Everyone is welcome and service users don't need to see a GP first. Service users can attend one of our walk-in clinics, book an appointment online 24/7 or speak to us on 0300 330 11 22.

Services available:

- Contraception all types
- Screening and treatment for sexually transmitted infections (STIs)
- Emergency contraception emergency contraceptive pills and emergency IUD
- Coil and implant fitting and removal
- Counselling and advice
- Psycho-sexual counselling and support, including support with erectile dysfunction
- Cervical cytology (smear tests)
- Pregnancy testing
- Vasectomy (following a referral from GP)
- Support with making a referral for termination

Think Sexual Assault, Think SARC...

The Sexual Assault Referral Centre in Teesside is calling for health professionals to signpost and refer into the service designed to provide a dedicated service to anyone who has experienced rape, sexual assault or other forms of sexual abuse.

SARC Teesside provides 24h support and is based at North Ormesby Health Village in Middlesbrough. Staff are specially trained to sensitively discuss the options available and facilitate onward support and recovery. The service is available without making a report to the police, though staff can support reporting if a client decides to proceed.

The centre has a forensic service for the purpose of obtaining evidence following a recent assault and evidence can be stored at the SARC to give clients time to consider their next steps. Due to the time limited nature of forensic and other immediate services, the recommendation is to make contact via the SARC 24h telephone number at the earliest opportunity.

SARC Teesside launched a new website this year with an integrated and secure professional and self-referral system linking directly into the SARC Case Management System. This is recommended for cases where abuse occurred more than ten days ago and is already proving popular with professionals. The telephone number however is also always available for advice and referrals. (www.sarcteesside.co.uk/professional-referral/).

Contraception Update...

The updated FSRH guideline on combined hormonal contraception Jan 2019

What is new in this guideline?

- The updated FSRH guideline highlights that there is no health benefit from the sevenday hormone-free interval
- Women can safely take fewer (or no) hormone-free intervals to avoid monthly bleeds, cramps and other symptoms
- If a hormone-free interval is taken, shortening it to four days could potentially reduce the risk of pregnancy if pills, patches or rings are missed
- Consultations about CHC do not necessarily have to be face-to-face; online CHC provision is possible
- •At the first consultation, many women can safely be prescribed a one year supply of CHC instead of the current three month supply

Training:

New FSRH Diploma qualification will be launched in Spring 2020. Further updates will be available in September 2019. The current Diploma qualification must be completed by candidates on 31 March 2021. There are no changes in Loc IUT and Loc SDI training requirements.

Reminder to all primary health care professionals to please send (either with the patient or beforehand) a brief summary of relevant medical/gynaecological history (include ultrasound reports if applicable)/medication list for all patients with complex health needs and not just signpost them to our clinics.

GUM Update...

The updated BASHH guidelines on Gonorrhea 20th January 2019

What is new in this guideline?

- First line empirical treatment is now monotherapy with ceftriaxone 1g intramuscularly.
- If antimicrobial susceptibility test results from all sites of infection are available prior to treatment and the isolate is sensitive to ciprofloxacin, then this should be used for treatment in preference to ceftriaxone.
- Epidemiological treatment is recommended only for those presenting within 14 days of exposure.

The updated BASHH national guideline for the management of infection with Mycoplasma genitalium (2018)

What is new in this guideline?

Testing recommendation – it is advised to test for Mycoplasma genitalium inpatients with - non-gonococcal urethritis, signs and symptoms suggestive of pelvic inflammatory disease, signs or symptoms of muco-purulent cervicitis, particularly post-coital bleeding, epididymitis and sexually-acquired proctitis.

Treatment: Doxycycline 100mg bd for seven days followed by azithromycin 1g orally as a single dose then 500mg orally once daily for 2 days.

PrEP trial (HIV Pre-exposure Prophylaxis)

What is it?

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, is a way for people who do not have HIV, but who are at substantial risk of HIV infection to reduce their risk of acquiring HIV. This involves taking the PrEP drug as instructed, prior to any exposures that might put the individual at high risk of getting HIV. The single-tablet PrEP drug contains two medicines (tenofovir and emtricitabine). This involves taking medication one tablet daily or event based as part of the trial for 3 years.

What does it entail?

Patients should be advised to contact Teesside Sexual Health clinic on 0300 330 1122 if they would like to take part in the trial. Patients will be assessed and started on treatment if they are eligible and fulfil the criteria. Any trial participants will be booked into clinic for a series of appointments with our Nurse Prescriber Jane Collins and/or our GUM Consultant Dr Sarup Tayal. The eligibility criteria for the trial are:

PrEP Impact Trial **PrEP Eligibility** A. Men (Cis - and Transgender) and Transgender Women 1. Have sex with men 2. Have had an HIV negative test during an earlier episode of care in the preceding year (43-365 days) 3. Report condomless intercourse (excluding oral) in the previous 3 months 4. Affirm their likelihood of having condomless intercourse (excluding oral) in the next B. HIV Negative Partner of an HIV Positive Person When: The HIV positive partner is not known to be virally suppressed (<200 copies/ml for 6 months or more): Condomless intercourse (excluding oral) is anticipated before treatment of the HIV positive partner takes effect C. HIV Negative Persons Who: Are clinically assessed and considered to be at similar high risk of HIV acquisition as those with a serodiscordant partner who is not known to be virally suppressed.
