The following vaccinations can be given at the practice:

Hepatitis A and Hepatitis A and B Combined Vaccine, Diptheria/Tetanus/Polio and Typhoid.

There are several private clinics in the city, which provided vaccines not available on the NHS, such as Rabies, Meningococcal vaccine, Tick Borne Encephalitis, Japanese B Encephalitis, Hepatitis B and Yellow Fever.
