WHO WE ARE

The Eric Liddell Centre is an independent charity that provides specialist caring services to the people of Edinburgh. The charity works out of a former church building in the south of the city.

Founded in 1980 by local people, all of our Board of Trustees live or work in the local community.

Our listed building was formerly Morningside North Parish Church and has been extensively modified to meet local community needs.

In 1992 the Centre was renamed the Eric Liddell Centre in memory of the inspirational 1924 Olympic 400m gold medalist who was portrayed in the film "Chariots of Fire". Eric Liddell studied in Edinburgh, lived locally, and had a strong belief in service to his local community.

WHAT WE DO

We operate a range of caring projects including:

- A registered Day Care Service for people with dementia.
- The Ca(I)re Programme that provides free educational, social and health based courses for carers.
- Tots Togs a charity shop selling quality, donated children's and babies wear.
- Café Connect a community café.
- Low cost office space for small charities.
- Rooms for hire for other groups providing classes and activities for the community.

WE MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Our registered Day Care Service for people with a diagnosis of dementia or cognitive impairment provides 70 places every week for people with medium to high level needs in a purpose-built day care centre where people get quality care.

The **Ca(I)re Programme** (putting the "I" into Care) helps carers in Edinburgh maintain their own good health and general wellbeing and enables them to fulfill their caring role. This is achieved through free educational, recreational and therapeutic courses, open days, a carer befriending service and weekly drop in support sessions.



We offer **Rooms for Hire** for nearly 200 other groups and companies annually providing activities for over 75,000 Centre users each year. If you are interested in hiring a suite or a room for your company or group please visit our website for individual room details and prices.

A number of local, national and international charities **lease offices** from the Centre. More information on leasing offices can be found on our website.

Our **Tots Togs Charity Shop**, situated within the Centre sells quality, donated babies and toddlers wear, supporting Edinburgh families on reduced incomes.

Café Connect, a community café at the heart of Centre life serves Centre users and other locals alike; whilst our Lunch Service provides a hot meal for people and/or carers and the person they care for, as part of their continued social integration in the community.

INCOME GENERATION

All of these activities have a cost. The charity needs to raise over £500,000 per year to provide services to those who need them. To maintain and expand our vital work we rely on the continuing support of the public.

Activities range from the rental of rooms to local people and organisations, and the leasing of offices to charities. We also run a community café within the Centre. In addition local authority funding supports our caring work.

Fundraising activities include annual fundraising events, overseas challenges and Tots Togs, our charity shop within the Centre. In addition, charitable trust grants support our work, whilst local companies and the public give to us through general donations.

According to experts, it is wise for charities to invest between 5 to 15% per cent of their income in good management and administration. We're proud to say that just 8p of every £1 that gets donated to us goes on administration. The rest goes on our services.
