## 1. News *(Click the header links)*

- **Tackling variation in the care of patients with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)**  
Improving access to specialist care and smoking cessation support are among actions that can help reduce variation in the care of patients with COPD, according to a new report.
- **New quality standard on psychosis and schizophrenia**  
NICE's new quality standard on psychosis and schizophrenia sets out eight quality statements designed to improve the care of adults living with the disorders.
- **First bladder cancer guideline to reduce variations in care**  
NICE's first guideline on bladder cancer aims to improve the diagnosis and management of the seventh most common cancer in the UK.
- **Focus care on the needs of the resident, says NICE**  
NICE has published a new briefing to help local authorities and partner organisations ensure that older people in care homes receive the best possible care.
- **Latest draft QOF and CCG OIS indicators unveiled**  
Ensuring patients with depression have access to psychological treatment through primary care, and encouraging commissioners and providers to improve the quality of obesity services in those with chronic conditions are among topics proposed in the latest set of draft QOF and CCG OIS indicators.
- **Draft guideline to improve asthma diagnosis**  
Spirometry should be used as the first-line investigation for diagnosing asthma in children over 5 and adults, says NICE.
- **Use NICE quality standards to guide good quality social care, says CQC**  
Social care services should use NICE guidance and quality standards to help identify and define good quality care, according to the Care Quality Commission (CQC).
