

Cervical Screening: The Facts

Cervical Screening (smear test) saves approximately 5,000 lives per year

This is **NOT** a test for cancer. A smear test simply help detect abnormal changes in the cells of the cervix at an early stage

This test will be performed by your fully trained Practice Nurses. These are:
Louise Mellenthin (Senior Practice Nurse)
Hayley Miller (Nurse Practitioner)

However you may also request this be done by a GP if you have difficulties.

Cervical Screening: The Test

You will be given privacy and asked to undress from the waist down, lie on an examination bed and cover yourself with a sheet

A single-use plastic instrument (speculum) will be inserted inside your vagina so your cervix can be seen.

A soft rubber brush is used to collect the cells from the cervix.
You may feel a gentle pressure at this point but it should not be painful.

The sample (cells) is placed in a pot of liquid and sent to the laboratory for testing

You will receive you results within 3-4 weeks

9 in 10 results come back Normal. Your results are sent to your home address. A copy is sent to your GP.
