Text service, how is it going? Terri sent a text message to all eligible patients that had up to date mobile numbers advertising the flu campaign, there was a very good turnout at the first clinic at Leven. More texts went out for the next clinic at Beeford on 1<sup>st</sup> October, and there will be another text going out for the last flu clinic at Leven on 15<sup>th</sup> October. Friends & Family feedback on the text service has been very good, with positive feedback being received from patients.

Flu campaign. Posters for the flu campaign went out to all local shops, delivery drops, local post offices and were also up in the two surgeries.

DNA's / Unused Meds. We currently advertise in the waiting room how much cost to the NHS for non-attended appointments, we are now putting a poster up advertising how much money was lost in non-used medication, in August alone it came to £2265. Doctors are now strongly encouraging patients to buy over the counter pain relief.

#### Any other business.

Lawrence Trender thought it would be a good idea for the group to do things to help the practice, as we give them such a good service. Ie: handing out flyers, organising a walking club, coming in to the surgery waiting room and chatting to patients etc. It was agreed this was a good idea, and will be discussed further at the next meeting.
