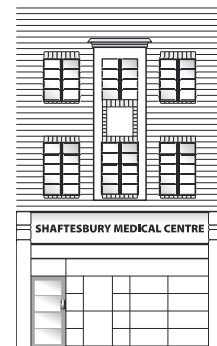

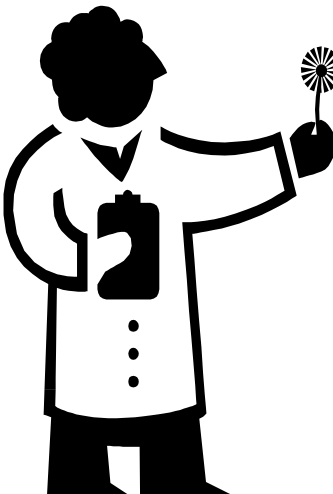

Health Tip—Hayfever

Hayfever is caused by an allergy to pollen. Pollen is the fine powder produced by plants/trees/flowers. Grass pollen is the most common cause and affects people from May to July. Other causes include tree pollen (March to May) and weed pollen (early spring to autumn).

Hayfever is very common 2 in 10 people in the UK and tends to run in families. It is also associated with Asthma and Eczema as Atopic conditions.

Most common symptoms are runny, itchy, blocked nose, sneezing and itchy eyes.



Diagnosis is made usually from the history and symptoms. Investigations are not routinely needed.

Treatment includes nasal sprays, antihistamines tablets and eye drops. Most hayfever medication is available over the counter and prescriptions not always needed.

NHS Bowel Cancer Screening Programme

Did you know that Bowel Cancer is the third most common cancer in the U.K.

If you are aged between 60-74 you will automatically be sent a free kit to help detect bowel cancer early. If you are over 75 and would like to be tested please call 0800 707 6060 to request your free kit.

The sample is collected in the privacy of your own home and sent to the laboratory for testing. You may think that doing the test sounds a bit embarrassing or unpleasant but it only takes a few minutes and is an effective way to detect bowel cancer early.

If you have any difficulty understanding how to use the kit kindly book an appointment to see the practice nurse who will be happy to explain.

DNA (did not attend) Rates

Please remember to cancel your appointment if you are unable to attend or no longer need it.

We are continuing to monitor our DNA rates as part of our commitment to making the best use of NHS resources.

We offer on average 940 appointments with a GP each month.

During the last 6 months, 570 GP appointments were lost due to non attendance and non cancellation. This is an average of 95 appointments per month.

A total of 10.1% of GP appointments were lost during the period.

This shows that the DNA rates have crept up by 0.5% since August 2010, however this is still an improvement on the figures from March 2010.

A total of 545 appointments were lost with other health professionals including the nurse, phlebotomist, dietician etc. This is an average of 90 appointments per month and shows a slight improvement on the figures from August 2010.

Once again a big Thank You to all patients who have remembered to cancel their appointments so that they can be offered to others.
