Access to coded GP Patient Records

Following implementation of the new on line repeat prescription ordering service and on line appointment booking at the end of last year, the surgery now offers access to coded GP patient records. This facility will automatically be available to all patients that register for the on line service from the middle of February onwards. If you registered before this time and you wish to access your record, you will need to contact the surgery and ask that the service be added to your on line profile.

KEEP WARM THIS WINTER

- Check on older neighbours and relatives
