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Practice News New GPs Starting In May

We'd like to introduce you to Dr Elizabeth Edwards and Dr Carolyn Rubens who will be joining us in May. Dr Elizabeth Edwards will be joining as a partner and will be working five sessions per week. Dr Edwards was born in Hastings and grew up in Bexhill-On-Sea and considers herself a local. Elizabeth completed her training and graduated from Bart's and The London School of Medicine and Dentistry in 2008. She then went on to complete her Foundation training in East Sussex and London. Subsequently, Elizabeth completed two years of Core Medical Training at Eastbourne Hospital. It was during her time at Eastbourne Hospital she realized her desire to become a GP. She went on to train as a GP in East London and qualified in August 2016. Since then, she has been working a



salaried GP in Tower Hamlets in London. New Practice Computer System

DrPenge described the work that is currently under way to completely change the Practice system, to bring it in line with the rest of the locality, and to provide much improvements for Patients who use the automated systems as well as staff in their day to day work. The new system will be introduced on April 26, and there will be a short changeover period when there will be some delays in receiving hospital reports and

processing repeat prescriptions. To help make this transition as smooth as possible, patients are asked to:

- Order repeat prescriptions in plenty of time ahead of the changeover (the practice will relax the rules about ordering early for this purpose)
- Not contact the surgery for routine blood test results between 25th April to 9th May if it can be avoided. The practice will continue to contact you if your results are urgent and you need to be seen.
- Be patient with staff during and after the changeover whilst they learn the new system

The practice will need to suspend automated and online appointment booking and online prescription ordering from the 1st April as systems are cleared down ready for the changeover.
