Latest news update from CHARLOTTE LUCK, Practice Manager

We have been able to secure three new salaried GPs to join our team at the Practice.

- Dr Tom Lever started with us in February
- Dr Sian Taylor joined us at the beginning of March
- Dr Cassandra Streeter will also be joining us on a permanent basis at the end of March, and
- Dr Emma Costello has also recently increased her working pattern to full time hours.

The addition of the extra GPs to our team will make a significant impact on the number of GP appointments we are able to offer patients. As we move into spring and out of winter pressures, we hope that patients will see a significant increase in our appointment offering.

Vaccines

It has been full speed ahead in terms of planning **vaccine clinics** at the surgery. A new Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) was introduced in September by NHS England. To date almost 600 patients have received this vaccine which protects against RSV, a common virus that can cause respiratory tract illnesses. RSV usually gets better by itself but in some people, especially babies and older adults in can cause pneumonia (a lung infection) and bronchiolitis (a chest infection that affects babies).

Further clinics will be taking place in spring, do keep a look out for your invite if you are aged between 75 to 79 or you are more than 28 weeks pregnant (getting vaccinated will help to protect your baby after they're born).

Almost 4,500 **flu immunisations** have been given to our patients this past winter.

The **spring covid booster** is available from April until 17 June and all patients who are aged 75 years and over (including those who turn 75 by 17 June 2025) are eligible, as are residents in care homes for older adults and individuals aged over 6 months old who are immunosuppressed. We are in the process of sending out booster invitations via text which contain 'self booking links'. You are also welcome to call our dedicated vaccination telephone line on 01435811560 to get booked in. Initial clinics are being held on:

Fri. 11 April at **Manor Oak**, 9am–11.30am. Sat. 12 April at **Buxted**, 9am–11.30am. Thur. 24 April at **East Hoathly**, 9am–12noon.
