OUR STI KITS ARE NOW MORE INCLUSIVE THAN EVER!

In the last few months, we have launched a new approach to our STI home test kits. We now have 4 different types of kits available. The image on the left shows each pack, who they are suitable for and what is included.

It is hoped that the new design and range of STI kits, helps to ensure our services remain inclusive of all gender identities & sexual orientations.

Vaginal pack

Suitable for:
All females

- Vaginal swab
- Finger prick blood test

Penis pack

Suitable for:
Males who only have sex with females

- Urine test
- Finger prick blood test

Vaginal + pack

Suitable for:
Trans male and non-binary people (born female)

- Vaginal swab
- Rectal swab
- Throat swab
- Finger prick blood test

Penis + pack

Suitable for:
Men who have sex with men, Trans female and non binary people (born male)

- Urine test
- Rectal swab
- Throat swab
- Finger prick blood test

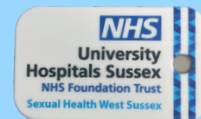

WORLD AIDS DAY

ROCK THE RIBBON

1 DECEMBER 2022

World Aids Day is a campaign run every year in December, to highlight the importance of preventing HIV transmission and reducing stigma. Today over 105,000 people in the UK live with HIV yet through research by The National Aids Trust, it showed 60% of the public do not remember seeing or hearing about HIV in the past 6 months. It also showed that 1 in 5 people think you can acquire HIV through kissing. This highlights the lack of knowledge in society surrounding HIV & AIDS. Remember, if a person living with HIV is receiving regular treatment, they cannot pass on the virus.



What can you do to show support?

World Aids Day is an opportunity to show solidarity with the millions of people living with HIV worldwide. This can include wearing a red ribbon and spreading the word to increase awareness and fight prejudice & HIV related stigma.

16 days of action for the elimination of violence of women & girls



Beginning on 25th November, this campaign highlights the continued efforts needed to eliminate gender-based violence. Emerging evidence from agencies across the UK has emphasised the increased risks of domestic abuse this year, with national domestic violence charity Refuge reporting a 25% increase in calls and online requests since the lockdown began in March 2020.

Transgender remembrance day

Trans Remembrance Day is an annual observance on November 20th that honours the memory of the transgender people whose lives were lost in acts of anti-transgender violence.

As we approach the festive season, we are keen to promote use of our online services. This includes our STI testing and Condom scheme for <25's. Please signpost where possible. We know that this time of year involves many parties and events over the seasonal period and a time to let loose and have fun.

Testing recommendations vary depending on whether you have a penis or vagina and who you have sex with. We have created an infographic to assist our service users in understanding the national testing guidance.

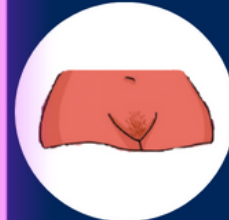
