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Access to patient records via NHS App

As you will be aware, practices were given the opportunity to postpone patients being given access to their prospective health data via the NHS App, by contacting EMIS/ TPP and instructing them not to make the relevant changes to the clinical system. For all other practices, access could be enabled from November 4th, 2022, unless GP Data Controllers chose to add the "104 code" to patients' records.

NHSE have advised that patient access to prospective heath data will be made available for all practices by November 30th 2022. The BMA however are continuing talks with NHSE to establish whether they can in fact dictate such changes en masse, when the GP practices remain the Data Controller and as outlined in the Data Protection legislation "determine the means of and purposes for any data processing."
