report. The review was independently chaired by Dr Nigel Watson in collaboration with NHS England, GPC and RCGP. We, alongside the GPC, welcome this report which addresses the issues of risk, workload, workforce and status in the system, and identifies the major problems as being about resources, implementation and delivery.

The Department of Health and Social Care has published their DDRB evidence for 2018-19, which can be accessed here.

The BMA have also submitted their <u>evidence</u> and published a statement which stated: "Many doctors are on the brink of breaking point with low levels of moral and plans to retire early. Since 2008 our members have experienced a real-terms pay cut of up to 30%. Many doctors are now on the brink of breaking point with low levels of morale and plans to retire early. To avert this crisis the Government and DDRB must recognise the value of doctors".
