14/05/3.1 **GP Health - Update Ref Minute 14/03/7**

> It was **CONFIRMED** that following electronic consultation with LMC GP members, it had been unanimously **AGREED** that:

Cleveland LMC Limited make a **donation** to GP Health of £15,000 for the next 12 months, to be paid quarterly at the rate of £3,750 per quarter, and to commence on 1 April 2014 and be reviewed after 12 months. The funding was to provide occupational health for Tees GPs only.

GP Health had been notified, in writing, and the first quarterly payment made.

14/05/5 ST CCG CONSIDERING APPLYING TO CO-COMMISSION PRIMARY CARE WITH AREA TEAM

Following Simon Stevens (Chief Executive, NHS England) call for pioneer CCGs to co-commission primary care with NHS England, South Tees CCG is considering putting an application forward and they have discussed this in the Middlesbrough Locality Meeting. ST CCG feels that despite its challenges of managing conflict, it also gives them an opportunity to shift resources rightfully into primary care (i.e. money follows activity).

Discussion centred around confusion over the number and variety of contracts and the different organisations who held them i.e. the PMS and GMS contracts held by NHSE, contracts with the CCG to provide local initiative schemes, contracts with the Local Authority to provide public health services including immunisations / health promotion / health prevention type work. This leads to confusion between organisations as to who is doing what and how investment can take place in general practice. Co-commissioning may lead to conflict of interest between the CCG and GPs when the CCG discusses the contract with GPs. ST CCG did not know if co-commissioning related to the national contract (core services/essential services) plus add-ons (enhanced services) in which case was this not re-inventing the wheel? And what would happen when patient boundary lists ceased in October and one patient was registered where they lived and their next door neighbour was registered where they worked — they could end up receiving different levels of treatment depending on whether their practice was in a CCG area contracted to provide co-commissioning.

CCGs expressions of interest, individually or with other CCGs, are to be developed by 20 June 2014. H&S CCG were not as advanced in their plans on co-commissioning as ST CCG. Discussions with stakeholders and an engagement process with practices / patient representatives had to have taken place by 20 June 2014 in order to put in an expression of interest. Co-commissioning has to be done within existing resources.

The Area Team has two years to do a review and formulate proposals relating to PMS practices; the AT had no wish to destabilise PMS practices and had agreed, in principle, that funding changes should be phased in the same way GMS funding is phased.

14/05/7 REGIONAL LMC FUNDING Extract from letter from Regional LMC Secretary

"At the last Regional Meeting (2 April 2014) we discussed the finance that needs to be raised in order to sustain this Committee. In the past we paid per GP represented, but this is variable and I think that it is more appropriate to charge per LMC, as all LMCs have the same number of seats at the table, etc.

Looking at the time that Maxine spends on the work involved and the cost of the venue, the annual cost to run this Committee is roughly £2660 per year. This is made up of 89 hours of Maxine's time and about £179 per meeting for the hotel costs. There is no charge for the Officers of the Regional Committee's time and perhaps we should discuss this at a later date, if appropriate.

My suggestion is that all LMCs contribute equally and that would be £380 per year per LMC, and this charge will be raised once per year after the April meeting."

The LMC Vice Chairman informed members that she had Chaired this particular Regional Meeting and funding of Officers of the Regional Committee had not been discussed. CLMC Officers received sessional payments and attending Regional Meetings was covered in that payment.

14/05/12.1 NHS Standard Contract

The Development Manager explained that the CCGs did not provide the contract to CLMC until mid-April; it is a huge document to process and the LMC wanted to be thorough in reviewing it for practices. It is vitally important that practices ensure they have <a href="https://example.com/huge-review-nath-huge-

With regard to the actual contract, the Development Manager had produced a brief guidance document highlighting some issues of concern for practices. The CCGs were currently considering the guidance document and the LMC will issue it to practices once their final response has been received. CLMC understands the financial difficulties practices are under, primarily due to cash flow in this first quarter, so are doing their utmost to progress this as quickly as possible. It is important CLMC does everything it can to get this contract as sound as possible for practices or, at the very least, ensure the LMC guidance provides all the appropriate information possible.

The e-contract is not written specifically for general practice and refers repeatedly to secondary care and CCGs. It also gives a 12 month termination period. It states the Data Protection Controller is the CCG but this is not correct for practices.

It was vitally important that Practice Managers read the LMC guidance document when it is issued and go through the e-contract. The Development Manager would be more than happy to take any questions from practices on janice.foster@tees.nhs.uk or 01642 745813.
