FLU VACCINATIONS

If you are aged 65 or over or suffer from a chronic condition such as asthma, diabetes, kidney disease or coronary heart disease you are strongly advised to have a flu vaccination.

CHILDHOOD FLU VACCINATIONS

Children aged 2, 3 and 4 years on the 1 September 2015 are invited to have a flu vaccine. The vaccine will be administered by nasal spray.

SHINGLES VACCINATION

If you were born on or between 02/09/42—01/09/45 or 02/09/35 and 01/09/37 you may be eligible to receive a shingles vaccination. We normally administer this at the same time as your flu vaccination but it can be given at any time and is a one-off vaccine. Other age groups will be introduced in the future to ensure all people aged 70-79 are offered the vaccine. We are not permitted to vaccinate patients outside the current cohort due to limited supply of the vaccine.

If you are eligible for a flu or shingles vaccination, please make an appointment with reception.

ONLINE SERVICES

From January 2015, we ceased to accept telephone requests for prescriptions.

Prescriptions can be ordered online, via your chemist or by posting or handing in the tear-off slip on the right-hand side of your prescription. Prescriptions can be collected by your chemist. If you would like us to send your prescription by post, please include a SAE.

The safest and most efficient way to order your repeat medication is by using our online service. This service can also be used for booking appointments with your GP.


If you wish to sign up to our online service, please bring photo ID (passport or driving licence photocard) to reception and we will provide you with a registration form.
