Croup calculator

Highfield Surgery has once again become an award winning practice in the GP enterprise awards for 2009 in the risk management category. In 2004 the practice won this national award for the use of clinical indications on all its repeat prescriptions. This time Dr Nigel Masters has developed a children's drug dose calculator for use in croup and young asthmatics at the practice. The simple calculator has been created on an everyday computer spreadsheet called Excel and has been is use for over one year. It was described by the organisers as a blockbuster idea which helps to reduce the risk of drug dosage errors in young patients. The practice now competes with five other practice category award winners to find the overall national champion for this prestigious competition.


18 PATIENTS DID NOT ATTEND THEIR APPOINTMENT WITH A NURSE AND DID NOT CANCEL

BBQ STARTER

For one person:

MIXED LEAF LETTUCE BACON GRATED CHEESE

GIVITED OFFICEOE

BALSAMIC VINEGAR

EGG

Grill bacon rashers until crisp and cut into small pieces. Spread lettuce on plate, add bacon and dribble some balsamic vinegar over. Sprinkle with grated cheese. Poach an egg until soft and runny and place on top.

SIMPLE BUT DELICIOUS and not too filling before your BBQ. Good idea to have this at least half an hour before the main food.
