## FLU CLINICS, PNEUMOVAX AND SHINGLES

Immunisation is one of the most successful and costeffective health protection measures. As usual, Cherrymead will take part in the annual push to protect patients at risk. We will immunise for flu, pneumococcal infection and shingles.

Influenza is an unpleasant but usually self-limiting disease for most healthy people. However, some groups are at risk of severe illness, if they catch it. These include children, older people, pregnant women and those with underlying disease.

Pneumococcal infection is a common cause of pneumonia. It can lead to invasive diseases such as meningitis and septicaemia. Hence, we include it for those at most risk

Shingles can be painful and debilitating. Its risk and severity increase with age, and can lead to neuralgia and hospitalisation. So, we routinely offer immunisation to patients aged 70 years, and as a catch-up to patients aged between 70 and 79.

High immunisation rates are key to preventing the spread of infectious diseases!

The 2015 Flu Clinics will be on:

Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> September

Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> October

Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> October.

Walk in sessions will be held on each day from 8am to 1pm.

Special clinics for children will be held on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. They will be by invitation only.

We will also offer a short test for atrial fibrillation at the Saturday clinics. Patients will hold a device that will take their pulse. It will send the data to a central point where a diagnosis will be made. We will then let patients have those results when they come back.

### SINUSITIS

The sinuses are airspaces in the face that help warm up the air when you breath through the nose.

The true reason for their existence Is not known! They do cause us problems however.

Sign/symptom	Sinusitis
Nasal Discharge	Cloudy or colored
Nasal Congestion	Often
Facial Pressure/Pain/Fullness	Often
Duration of Illness	10 days or longer
Double-worsening*	Sometimes
Fever	Sometimes
Pain in Upper Teeth	Sometimes
Bad Breath	Sometimes
Coughing	Sometimes
Sneezing	No

# Note: see a doctor if symptoms become severe or do not ease within a week



### What can you do to help?

- Painkillers such as paracetamol or ibuprofen will usually ease any pain. They will also help to bring down any high temperature (fever) that you may have.
- \* Decongestant nasal sprays or drops are sometimes used. You can buy these from pharmacies. They may briefly relieve a blocked nose. You should not use a decongestant spray or drops for more than 5-7 days at a time. If they are used for longer than this, they may cause a worse congestion in the nose.
- \* Keeping hydrated can be helpful, so have plenty of drinks.
- \* Warm face packs held over the sinuses may help to ease pain.
- \* Saline nasal drops may help to relieve congestion and blockage in the nose.

### HOW MANY DOCTORS WORK AT CHERRYMEAD SURGERY?

At present, there are four partners working full time at the surgery, Dr King, Dr Fraser, Dr Hettiarachchi and Dr Bera. Dr Hettiarachchi will be leaving for family reasons in September.



He will be replaced by Dr Malki Gamage, a lady doctor. Ideally, we would have five full time partners who see patients using the Doctor First system. It allows more patients to be seen sooner than other appointment systems. It has reduced time wasted when patients have not attended after booking in advance.

Funding to GP surgeries has been reduced over the last few years. The number of patients who need to be seen is increasing as is the amount which is not related to patient care. That is now so high that increasing numbers of doctors are leaving General Practice to work as locums, in the private sector, or abroad.

All these mean that we are not in a position to recruit an additional full time partner or salaried GP. To stretch our funding and ensure that you see a permanent GP as much as possible, we try to employ locums only to cover partner leave. You may be booked in with a locum from time to time. That may be with one you haven't met before. We are keeping this under regular review.

### FILM REVIEW: INSIDE OUT



The very best children's films are ambitious, complex, deeply layered movies for grown-ups. They just happen to have characters, colours and clear plot lines which appeal to children as well. "Inside Out" is such a film. It is a bold, sweet, funny, and sometimes sad adventure that deserves an Academy Award nomination for best picture. It tells of Riley, a young girl, her emotions, and memories.

The story-teller and guide is Joy (Amy Poeh-

ler). She introduces us to Riley's other primary emotions, including: Sadness (Phyllis Smith), who can colour memories forever by touching them; Fear (Bill Hader), who views every experience as potentially disastrous, but is sometimes a valuable asset.; Anger (Lewis Black) ready to throw a tantrum whenever things don't go Riley's way; Disgust (Mindy Kaling), who, like my own little girl, doesn't like Broccoli.

They live in the "Headquarters", the control centre of Riley's mind in charge of memories. At first things are pretty simple for Baby Riley. She feels the Joy of parental love, Disgust when she tastes broccoli, and Fear of noisy household appliances, etc., etc. But then we jump forward to Riley's world at age 11, when the family moves to San Francisco because her father has a new job. Riley has to cope with tension between her parents and living in a less-than-desirable area. She misses her friends and feels like an outcast at her new school. As Riley becomes ever more sad and bitter, Disgust, Fear, and Anger take control. So Joy goes on a frantic quest to become a constant presence in Riley's life again and to regain control. The film is directed with great flair and timing. It brims with sparkling visuals, and has first-rate voice performances. The adventures are thrilling with unforgettable moments. In short, "Inside-Out" is an instant classic.
