Vaccines for over 65s
Appointments from 24th September – BOOK NOW!

Vaccines for 18-64 year olds
Appointments from mid-October – BOOK NOW!

Vaccines for under 18s (Child Flu)

Appointments only available after stock delivery confirmed (Oct/Nov)

The eligible groups are:

- Patients aged 65 years and over (including those turning 65 by 31/3/2020)
- Patients aged six months to 64 years in clinical risk groups (details available from reception)
- Pregnant women
- Patients in long-stay residential care homes
- Carers
- Morbidly Obese (BMI of 40 & above)
- Household contacts of immunocompromised individuals
- Health & Social Care Staff caring for vulnerable/elderly patients
- Certain groups of children (details available from reception)

NHS penalty charge notices

In England, many patients pay for their NHS prescriptions and this is an important source of funding for the NHS. Each year, the NHS loses significant funds due to people claiming free prescriptions they weren't entitled to. Checks are carried out on patient claims and if it cannot be confirmed that a patient was entitled to claim free NHS prescriptions, they will be sent a Penalty Charge Notice. The following advice may be useful:

- If you believe you have received this in error and can prove a mistake has been made, you can apply to have the Penalty Charge Notice cancelled
- It is your responsibility to make sure all details on the back of the prescription have been completed properly check the correct boxes are ticked
- If you do pay for prescriptions, it is advisable to keep proof of payment or pay by card
