The GPs will prioritise these appointments based on urgency so you may not be seen on time.

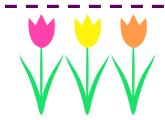
Please take this into consideration when accepting an urgent appointment.

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PATIENT GROUP

Shingles Eligibility

You are eligible for the vaccine from the 1st September AFTER your 70th birthday. You remain eligible until your 80th birthday, however there are some exclusions. If you are unsure about eligibility please speak to a receptionist.



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Charges for Non-NHS services

Why do GPs sometimes charge fees?

It is important to understand that GPs are not employed by the NHS, they are self-employed and have to cover their costs for staff, building, heating etc, the same as any small business. The NHS covers the cost for NHS work but not for non-NHS work, the fees charged by GPs contribute towards these costs.

Why does it sometimes take my GP a long time to complete any form?

Time spent completing non-NHS forms and preparing reports takes the GP away from the medical care of his or her patients. Most GPs have a very heavy workload and paperwork takes up an increasing amount of their time, so many GPs find they have to take some paperwork home at night and weekends.

I only need the doctor's signature.

When a doctor signs a certificate or completes a report, it is a condition of remaining on the General Medical Council (the doctor's regulatory body) that they only sign what they know to be true. In order to complete even the simplest of forms, therefore, the doctor might have to check the patient's entire medical record. Carelessness or an inaccurate report can have serious consequences for the doctor with the General Medical Council or the Police.

Do GPs have to do non-NHS work for their patients?

With certain limited exceptions, for example a GP confirming that one of their patients is not fit for jury service, GPs do not have to carry out non-NHS work on behalf of their patients. Whilst GPs will always attempt to assist their patients with the completion of forms, for example for insurance purposes, they are not required to do such non-NHS work.

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Book appointments and order prescriptions online via patient access. To register simply come for the service into the surgery with photo ID and complete the registration form. You will then be log-in details sent vour through the post enabling you to access the website.



As of 26th April, Phlebotomy services at Princess House in the square have been stopped. If you need a blood test you can either book an appointment at the surgery, Mon-Fri, mornings only. Or you can attend the drop-in service at the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital, Mon-Fri 8.45am—4.45pm (fasting) or 1pm-4.45pm (non-fasting).



If you have been advised to have vaccinations for a holiday abroad please book an appointment with one of our practice nurses who will discuss the relevant information with you. Should you require any vaccinations before going on your holiday you will be informed by the nurse during the appointment and will be advised of any follow up appointments needed.

Some holiday vaccinations are chargeable, you will be advised of costs during your initial appointment and payment will be required before you have the vaccine administered.

Due to high demand the GPs are only able to complete triage calls in the morning. There are a limited number of calls available per day and we do request that if you have an urgent query that you call be 10:30am in order to be triaged.
