We are pleased to inform you that our much awaited new telephone system finally went live at the end of November. We have also increased the number of incoming lines and hope this considerably improves the telephone access to the surgery.


Please accept our apologies if you have had trouble getting through to the surgery recently – we hope you notice a difference.

Please use **01283 563451** (previously the appointments line) to ring the surgery, whatever the reason for your call. (Our old enquiry line number still gets through to the surgery but we won't be using different numbers for

different things anymore). Up to 6 calls can be answered or queued at a time and callers will hear the engaged tone if the 6 lines are busy. We hope this keeps the wait time to a minimum as we are conscious calls are charged whilst in the queue.

Please help us to help you when calling the surgery

When you ring the surgery you will notice Dr Georgiou has recorded a new message advising that the reception team will be asking patients for further information in order to help them deal with the call in the most appropriate way. This is known as 'active signposting' and is being introduced in other local surgeries too.





Message from our Clinical Pharmacist

Hi! My name is Manzar. I'm a Clinical Pharmacist and I'm delighted to join the ever growing multidisciplinary team at Bridge Surgery. As a registered professional and a prescriber, I can provide expert advice on medicines as well as prescribe medications. I can manage long term conditions and ensure patients are taking medications that are working for them. I can also help patients make changes to their lifestyle to best manage their medical conditions. If patients are experiencing side effects of medications, I can help by making changes to the medicine or changing how much they are taking. Patients who are on multiple medications can also seek advice from me as I can ensure they are all working well together. I also conduct medication reviews with patients and health checks such as measure blood pressure and arrange required blood tests. I also do other admin duties for the surgery such as process discharge letters to ensure a patient's medication list is up to date and sign repeat medication prescriptions. NB Patients still have to attend their community pharmacy to collect any prescribed medications.

Extended Access

Following a National Government initiative from 1st September 2018 extra appointments will be offered across the whole of East Staffordshire, including evening and weekend appointments. Additionally a new online digital service will be available on Sunday mornings where appointments will be offered with a GP via the Q Doctor smartphone App. All practices across East Staffordshire are participating in this extended access.

FLU - it's too big to ignore

Vaccination is the most effective way to prevent flu. Although anyone can catch flu, certain people are at greater risk from the implications of flu, as their body may not be able to fight the virus. If you are pregnant, 65 years or over, morbidly obese, suffer from severe asthma, chronic liver disease, diabetes or immunosuppression, have a heart, kidney or lung condition, have suffered a stroke or transient ischaemic attack, you are considered at greater risk from flu and the implications could be serious.

We are also offering flu vaccinations to children aged 2 - 3 years (born between 01/09/14 - 31/08/16) who are given a nasal spray.
