New prescribing policy in **Birmingham and Solihull**

Prescriptions for over the counter medicines for the following minor ailments may no longer be available from your GP:

Acne (mild) e.g.

• Creams, lotions and gels for treating acne

Acute pain, sprains, headache, fever, infrequent migraine, cold and flu

symptoms e.g.

- Paracetamol
- Ibuprofen
- Co-codamol 8/500 (tablets, capsules, liquids and soluble forms)

Cold sores (occasional) e.g.

• Creams and other preparations to treat occasional cold sores

Constipation (infrequent) e.g.

- Lactulose
- Senna
- Bisacodyl

Coughs, colds and nasal congestion

- e.g.
- All cough syrups and linctuses, including simple linctus, pholcodine linctus, codeine linctus
- Decongestant tablets, nasal drops and sprays
- Inhalations

Dandruff and cradle cap e.g.

- Cradle cap treatment shampoos
- Dandruff shampoos

Dental and sore mouth products e.q.

- Fluoride toothpaste, mouthwash, oral drops and tablets
- Mouth ulcer treatments
- Preparations for oral thrush
- Teething gels

Diarrhoea (simple infrequent episodes in adults only) e.g.

- Oral rehydration sachets
- Loperamide

Ear wax e.g.

• Ear wax softeners e.g. olive oil, almond oil and branded preparations to soften ear wax

Eye care e.g.

- Soothing drops and artificial tears for dry or sore, tired eyes
- Products to treat conjunctivitis

Haemorrhoids (piles) e.g.

 Soothing haemorrhoidal creams and suppositories

Hay fever (mild to moderate) and seasonal rhinitis e.g.

- Antihistamines
- Nasal sprays
- Eye drops

Head lice e.g.

 Lotions and other preparations to treat head lice

Indigestion and heartburn (short-term) e.g.

- Antacids
- Ranitidine tablets
- Omeprazole

Infant colic e.g.

• Drops and liquids for infant colic

Insect bites and stings e.g.

- Creams for itching
- Antihistamines

Nappy rash e.g.

• All nappy rash creams

Other skin conditions e.g.

- Emollient creams and lotions for mild irritant dermatitis
- Steroid creams for mild irritant dermatitis
- · Antifungal creams for athletes' foot and ringworm

Rubifacients e.g.

• Creams, gels and sprays for sore muscles

Sore throat e.g.

Sunscreens e.g.

Threadworms e.g.

Travel sickness e.g.

Vitamins, multivitamin and mineral preparations (except to treat a clinical proven deficiency)
