# Current support for people with sensory loss in Aberdeenshire

Below is an outline of the services providing support in Aberdeenshire for people who are Deaf, have hearing loss or sight loss. It includes information about each service and what is being provided during the Covid19 pandemic. Services will be subject to adjustments in line with changing government guidelines.

# **Community Optometry**

For any sight issues contact your local Optometrist. They are able to deal with a wide range of eye related issues and will refer you to the eye clinic as needed.

# **Community Audiology**

Hearing testing is available in the community. An initial referral is required from your GP, once you have been seen by audiology you are able to contact them directly for further support.

# **Eye Clinic**

Referral through the GP and high street Optometrist. They are continuing to investigate and treat eye and sight issues.

The North East Sensory Services Hospital Information Officer (Eddie Carroll), based at the Eye Clinic, will make onward referrals to services in Aberdeenshire. He is now working from the Eye Clinic again meeting people face to face.

Provides support to people with sight loss in Aberdeenshire. We are part of the Aberdeenshire Health and Social Care Partnership and provide services to people of any age with severe, permanent sight loss. We offer services relating to :

getting around, either indoors or outdoors;

- communication, support with using various equipment for communication including phones, computers, reading and writing;
- day to day activities, support with managing daily living activities where there are issues relating to sight loss;
- support with accessing benefits relating specifically to sight loss;
- scanning and reading strategies including eccentric viewing

We also provide equipment on long term loan free of charge following an assessment of need.

# Current support/service:

We follow the current government guidance and take all precautions when visiting. Our first option is to provide support remotely, either via phone or virtual options. Outdoor and indoor visits are available dependent on the current guidance. We are able to post out equipment to meet the persons needs following phone/virtual assessment.

The Aberdeenshire Eye Clinic Liaison Officer (ECLO) post is part funded by Aberdeenshire Council and employed by RNIB and supports the work of the Aberdeenshire Council Visual Impairment Team. Our Eye Clinic Liaison Officer (ECLO) in Aberdeenshire provides emotional and

practical support for people with a sight condition, providing support to adults and children, their family members and carers.

**Current support/services**: phone contact to people with sight loss to identify their needs, provide onward referral and post out basic equipment following a needs assessment.

Deaf Action provide a free Information, Advice and Guidance service (which includes specialist equipment i.e. flashing/loud doorbells, amplified telephones, neck loops, TV headphones, vibrating alarm

clocks) to anyone living in Aberdeenshire with a diagnosed hearing loss. This includes people who are hard of hearing, deafened, deafblind and BSL users. We can accept referrals from all sources, including self-referral. We visit service users at home, where we provide an assessment and then install equipment, if required. The equipment is provided on a long-term loan basis, free of charge and we will also repair or replace faulty equipment. We also help people to maintain their NHS hearing aids by running drop-in sessions across Aberdeenshire.

### **Current support/service:**

The hearing aid drop-in sessions are still currently closed but we can post out hearing aid batteries and can arrange a non-contact home visit to retube hearing aids as required. Home visits for equipment assessments have restarted. We follow the current government guidance and take all precautions when visiting. Contact Sam or Rosemary for further advice.

Aberdeenshire Sensory Support Service is a peripatetic, educational service, which specialises in working with children and young people who have a diagnosed visual impairment or hearing loss.

The service works with babies, children and young people (from birth to school leaving age), parents/carers, families, staff in schools, nurseries, other agencies and third sector organisations. They provide resources and advice to support families and to help pupils access the school curriculum.
