Hayfever Season

Hayfever symptoms such as itchy/watery eyes, sneezing, runny/congested nose and itchy skin can often be easily treated with over the counter preparations – Please consult your friendly local chemist for advice and information about how to keep this under control. If you regularly suffer with seasonal symptoms don't delay – we suggest starting your treatments 2-4 weeks before your symptoms usually begin.

Skin Tags

These are considered "Procedures' of Limited Clinical Priority" (PLCP) by the Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG). This means that they are no longer funded on the NHS unless exceptional circumstance criteria are met.

If a skin tag has changed, is unusually large or you are worried about it we are happy to see you in clinic to check it for you. Occasionally, if the doctor is concerned, we can make arrangements for this to be frozen using Cryotherapy or removed on the NHS.

Multiple/small or simple tags will not be treated for cosmetic or minor inconvenience reasons and we suggest you seek removal through a private clinic if you wish to do so.
