

How to complete your FIT test











A FIT test shows if there is any blood in a sample of your poo.



FIT stands for:
Faecal
Immunochemical
Test



You cannot always see the blood with your eyes



But the **FIT test** will **spot** any **blood** in your **poo** even if it is only a **small amount**.



You have been given this **FIT test** to **work out** what is **causing** your **health problem**.



Step 1 Collect your poo



First of all please wash your hands.



Then **find something** to put your **poo into.**



Do not let your poo touch the water in the toilet.



Here are **some ways** you could **collect your poo** for the **FIT test.**



Put cling film over the toilet.

Make sure the cling film is a bit loose.



Use any clean plastic container such as



- o an ice cream tub
- a box you get with a takeaway
- cartons that fruit or veg come in



 A plastic bag or a glove over your hand



 Folded toilet paper in your hand.




Step 2 Make sure your details are on the bottle




- your name
- your date of birth
 the date you do the FIT test



Please use a **black or blue pen** if you are **writing** on your **details**



If your **details** are **already** on the **label** please **make sure** that they are **correct**.



Step 3 Collect your sample



Twist the cap to open the sample bottle.



Scrape the stick along the poountil the lines on the end of the stick are covered in poo.

You **only** need a **small amount** of **poo** for the **FIT test**.



Please do not put too much poo on the stick.



Step 4 Put your sample in the bottle




Put the stick back in the sample bottle and click the cap to close it.



Do not reopen the bottle



Now please wash your hands.



Step 5 Send your sample



After you have collected your FIT test sample please send it back as soon as possible.



Your **GP will tell you** if you **need to**:



- Drop your sample at your GP surgery
- Send it by post
