

Glasgow City HSCP Flu and COVID-19 Winter Vaccinations 2024

Flu and COVID-19 vaccines will be offered to those eligible between September and December. The vaccination programme will start in the community on Tuesday 1st October 2024.

It's strongly recommended you get vaccinated if you're eligible this winter. Invitations for people who are eligible are now being sent. You may receive your invitation at a different time than previous years. You should attend the appointment you've been given, or make or rearrange your appointment as soon as possible.

The postal invites will arrive in white envelopes with clear NHS Scotland branding. People with a digital preference will receive their vaccine appointment or prompt to book by text and/or email.

Please do not try to make an appointment until you've been invited by NHS Scotland. If you need to rearrange an appointment you can do so by phone or online:

You can phone the national vaccination helpline on **0800 030 8013** to book an appointment. The helpline is open from 9am-6pm Monday to Friday and 9am – 1pm on Saturdays. It is closed on Sundays.
