Message in a Bottle

A supply of bottles are available at reception. If you know a vulnerable person who would benefit from one of these please feel free to take one away for them. The bottle is placed in the fridge door with information on the person's medical conditions, medication next of kin etc. and a sticker is placed on the inside of the front door. Should the Emergency Services be reguired, they would know to look in the fridge for this information.

Pharmacy Collection Service

Many local pharmacies offer a prescription collection service. When you sign up in Practice for this, we will send your prescription direct to the pharmacy for you, **EVERY** time you order a prescription, even if this is arranged by telephone via the nurse or doctor, saving you a trip to the surgery.

To sign up, ask for a consent form at reception and order your prescriptions as normal. Please allow time for your pharmacy of choice to collect and dispense your prescription. This can take a day or two from ordering from the Practice.

Patient Participation Group

Our Patient Participation Group met again recently and celebrated our first birthday with a cake. We also premiered our promotional video which is now running in the waiting room. The meetings are always very positive for all involved and provide the Practice with ideas for improvements to services and access.

How to Order Prescriptions Online

- Click the link at the bottom of the homepage Order your Repeat Prescription Securely Online
- A new window will appear showing the order form.
- Type in your details (those marked with a red asterisk * are required fields.
- Fill in the list of your repeat medications.
- Under the heading *Sending Your Request* there is a tickbox
- Remember my details on this computer for next time.
 By keeping this ticked, the computer will populate your list next time you visit. Then all you need to do is tick the items you wish to order.
- Click the send button and you will receive a message telling you your request was successfully sent.
