When should you refer a patient?

Step 1

Assess the burn, refer if any of the following:

Size: Any size of burn in those <u>aged 15 or under</u> with a <u>TBSA ≥ 1%</u>

Depth: All full thickness burns

Site: Burns to face, hands, perineum and/or chest

Circumferential burns or involving a major joint

Mechanism: Chemical, electrical, friction or cold injuries

Suspected <u>non-accidental injury</u> or <u>neglect</u>

Co-morbidity: <u>Inhalation</u> injury

All children with child protection concerns

Other: Any children 'unwell' shortly after a burn injury of any size

Any burn injury not healed within 2 weeks

Step 2

If any of these issues exist, complete an online referral form https://nww.mdsas.nhs.uk/burns/ attaching photos if possible

Step 3

Unwell child with a burn

If a child presents with any of the following symptoms following a burn injury, a full re-assessment is required at the Burns Centre

- ◆ High Temperature (>38^c) ◆ A rash ◆ Diarrhoea and/or vomiting ◆ Tachycardia/Tachypnoea
 - General malaise not eating or drinking, lethargy, irritability
