How your information is shared so that we can meet legal requirements

The law requires the practice to share information from your medical records in certain circumstances. Information is shared so that the NHS or Public Health Wales can, for example:

- plan and manage services;
- check that the care being provided is safe;
- prevent infectious diseases from spreading.

We will share information with NHS Wales Informatics Service, the Care Quality Commission and local health protection team (or Public Health Wales) when the law requires us to do so. Please see below for more information.

We must also share your information if a court of law orders us to do so.

NHS Wales Informatics Service

- NHS Wales Informatics Service (NWIS) is a national body which has legal responsibilities to collect information about health and social care services.
- It collects information from across the NHS in Wales and provides reports on how the NHS is performing. These reports help to plan and improve services to patients.
- This practice must comply with the law and will send data to NHS Wales Informatics Service, for example, when it is told to do so by the Secretary of State for Health or NHS Wales under the Health and Social Care Act 2012.

Health Inspectorate Wales (HIW)

- HIW regulates health and social care services to ensure that safe care is provided.
- Serious events may be reported to HIW for investigation, for example, when patient safety has been put at risk.

Public Health

- The law requires us to share data for public health reasons, for example to prevent the spread of infectious diseases or other diseases which threaten the health of the population.
- We will report the relevant information to local health protection team or Public Health Wales

Rights to object	NHS Wales Informatics Service
	 You will not be able to object to your data being shared with NWIS when it is legally required under the Health and Social Care Act 2012
	Public health
	 Legally information must be shared under public health legislation. This means that you are unable to object.
	Care Quality Commission
	 Legally information must be shared when the Care Quality Commission needs it for their regulatory functions. This means that you are unable to object.
	Court order
	Your information must be shared if it ordered by a court. This means that you are unable to object.
Right to access and correct	 You have the right to access your medical record and have any errors or mistakes corrected. Please speak to a member of staff or look at our Access to Medical Records policy on the practice website – http://www.llanishencourtsurgery.org.uk/info.aspx?p=20
	 We are not aware of any circumstances in which you will have the right to delete correct information from your medical record; although you are free to obtain your own legal advice if you believe there is no lawful purpose for which we hold the information and contact us if you hold a different view.
